Parents took on the challenge of assisting students through online learning, students adapted to attending class and learning in entirely new environments, and our staff embraced the task of teaching both content and technology simultaneously.

We were fortunate to move into our new building for the 20-21 School Year and begin establishing new routines and procedures with all of our grade levels together in one location. This new location allows us to more effectively allocate staff and resources to serve our Students and Families. 

Enrollment

At the end of the school year, we had 263 students enrolled. Due to COVID-19 about $\frac{2}{3}$ of our students were virtual & $\frac{1}{3}$ were hybrid until March. All students were hybrid for the remainder of the school year.

Special Events

During the school year, we had many special events involving our families including virtual family reading events, a Pumpkin Run, open house, and virtual parent-teacher conferences.

Our Students and Families:

- 89% of our enrolled students are African American, 5% are Caucasian, 3% are Multi-Ethnic, and .5% Other.
- 98% of our students live at least 1 mile from SunBridge Schools.
- 100% of our families report income at or below the federal poverty level, based on the federal free/ reduced lunch eligibility guidelines.
- 20% of our students are on an Individualized Education Plan for Special Education Services (IEP).


